Admissions documents required:

1. Completed admission application, which also serves as the scholarship application
2. \$40 nonrefundable application fee or fee waiver
3. Official high school transcript reflecting unweighted GPA and class rank (if available)

The first step is applying for admission. At Oklahoma State, we're committed to helping qualified students get admitted to OSU to earn their college degrees.

Maximize your scholarship opportunities

Your application for admission is also your application for scholarships, but you could qualify for additional scholarships with these items:

- Official ACT or SAT test score(s)
- Completed essay response
- Leadership and involvement resume (honors, employment, activities, etc.)

The Early Opportunity Scholarship Deadline is **Nov. 1**, while all scholarship materials must be submitted by **Feb. 1** to ensure scholarship consideration for most awards for fall-entering students. Students may only receive the award with the highest value they are eligible for from the University Assured Scholarship or Partnered Scholarship categories. Exceptions include Oklahoma's Promise and Cowboy Covenant, which can be combined with one award in the University Assured Scholarship or Partnered Scholarship categories. If selected, students may receive either the President's Distinguished Scholarship or the President's Leadership Council Scholarship. Either award may be combined with other university scholarships. Students must maintain a minimum GPA and number of credit hours per semester to renew assured scholarship opportunities each year. Renewable scholarship qualifications may vary.

ACT and SAT scores are computed without the essay score. OSU will accept the official superscore provided by ACT for both admission and scholarship consideration. Important Dates for Senior Year

- JULY 1** Students can apply for admission at apply.okstate.edu starting July 1 after their junior year of high school.
- FEB. 1** Housing registration opens at 8 a.m. at reslife.okstate.edu for admitted students who have submitted their enrollment deposit.
- AUG. 1** Starting Aug. 1, students can apply for admission using the Common App.
- FEB. 1** Registration for orientation and enrollment opens at 8 a.m. at newstudents.okstate.edu for admitted students who have submitted their enrollment deposit.
- NOV. 1** **Early Opportunity Scholarship Deadline.** Apply by Nov. 1 to receive early scholarship and financial aid notification, and to compete for the highest level academic college awards.
- MARCH 1** Room selection begins for students selected for a Living Learning Program.
- DEC. 1** Upon admission, submit your enrollment deposit beginning Dec. 1 at 8 a.m. at okla.st/portal to be eligible to register for housing and orientation and enrollment.
- APRIL 1** Room selection begins for admitted students who have registered for housing.
- DEC./JAN.** File your 2024-2025 FAFSA as soon as possible at fafsa.gov to maximize your financial aid consideration using **OSU school code 003170**. The date the FAFSA opens will be determined by the Department of Education.
- MAY 1** Deadline to accept some scholarships and financial aid or to cancel your enrollment and receive a partial refund (\$250) of your enrollment deposit.
- AUGUST** Submit updated test scores and transcripts for the **Final Scholarship Deadline** by the Friday before classes begin for scholarship updates.
- FEB. 1** **Priority Scholarship Deadline.** Apply or update your test scores, transcripts or scholarship file by Feb. 1 to ensure maximum scholarship consideration.

Ways to be Admitted

COMPREHENSIVE REVIEW

At Oklahoma State University, ALL STUDENTS are encouraged to apply because we individually review each application for our holistic and alternative admission programs. We consider many factors, including high school GPA, ACT or SAT scores, application essay response, academic letters of recommendation, leadership experience, community involvement and accomplishments.

ASSURED ADMISSION

Students qualify for assured admission if they meet ONE of the following criteria:

- 3.0 unweighted cumulative GPA or higher **AND** top 33.3% rank in high school graduating class, **OR**
- 3.0 GPA or better in 15-unit core **AND** 21 ACT/1060 SAT or higher, **OR**
- 24 ACT/1160 SAT or higher.

TEST OPTIONAL

Students have the option to apply to OSU without consideration of a test score. Students who select this option on the application will be considered for admission based on a full review of their high school transcript. Class rank is not required for test optional admission. This also applies to home school, private, parochial or other non-public high schools that are not accredited by a recognized accrediting agency.

Currently, consideration for most university scholarships requires an official test score from ACT or SAT, and we encourage students to provide us their test scores as soon as they are available for maximum scholarship consideration.

OSU will accept the official superscore provided by ACT for both admission and scholarship consideration. Some majors may have additional requirements, visit okla.st/program-admission for more information.

15-Unit Core Curricular Requirements: 4 units of English (Grammar, Composition and Literature); 3 units of Mathematics (Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II and above); 3 units of History and Citizenship Skills (Must include 1 unit of American History and 2 units from the subjects of History, Economics, Geography, Government, Civics and/or Non-Western Culture); 3 units lab science (Biology, Chemistry, Physical Sciences, Physics or any lab science certified by school district) and 2 units of other courses selected from any of the sections above or Computer Science or Foreign Language.
