## Admissions documents required:

1. Completed admission application, which also serves as the scholarship application
2. \$40 nonrefundable application fee or fee waiver
3. Official high school transcript reflecting unweighted GPA and class rank (if available)

The first step is applying for admission. At Oklahoma State, we're committed to helping qualified students get admitted to OSU to earn their college degrees.

## Complete your scholarship file

Your application for admission is also your application for scholarships, but your file is not complete until we have these items:

- Official ACT or SAT test score(s)
- Completed essay responses
- Leadership and involvement experience (honors, employment, activities, etc.)

The Early Opportunity Scholarship Deadline is **Nov. 1**, while all scholarship materials must be submitted by **Feb. 1** to ensure scholarship consideration for most awards for fall-entering students. Students may only receive the award with the highest value they are eligible for from the University Assured Scholarship or Partnered Scholarship categories. Exceptions include Oklahoma's Promise and Cowboy Covenant, which can be combined with one award in the University Assured Scholarship or Partnered Scholarship categories. If selected, students may receive either the President's Distinguished Scholarship or the President's Leadership Council Scholarship. Either award may be combined with other university scholarships. Students must maintain a minimum GPA and number of credit hours per semester to renew assured scholarship opportunities each year. Renewable scholarship qualifications may vary.

ACT and SAT scores are computed without the essay score. OSU will accept the official superscore provided by ACT for both admission and scholarship consideration. # Important Dates for Senior Year

- JULY 1

Students can apply for admission to OSU starting July 1 after their junior year of high school.
- OCT. 1

FAFSA filing opens at [fafsa.gov](https://fafsa.gov). File your 2023-2024 FAFSA as soon as possible beginning Oct. 1 for the most financial aid consideration using **OSU school code 003170**.
- NOV. 1

Early Opportunity Scholarship Deadline. Apply by Nov. 1 to receive early scholarship and financial aid notification, and to compete for the highest level academic college awards.
- DEC. 1

Upon admission, submit your enrollment deposit beginning Dec. 1 at 8 a.m. at [okla.st/portal](https://okla.st/portal) to be eligible to register for housing and orientation and enrollment.
- FEB. 1

Priority Scholarship Deadline. Apply or update your test scores, transcripts or scholarship file by Feb. 1 to ensure scholarship consideration.
- FEB. 1

Housing registration opens at 8 a.m. at [reslife.okstate.edu](https://reslife.okstate.edu) for admitted students who have submitted their enrollment deposit.
- FEB. 1

Registration for orientation and enrollment opens at 8 a.m. at [fys.okstate.edu](https://fys.okstate.edu) for admitted students who have submitted their enrollment deposit.
- MARCH 1

Room selection begins for students selected for a Living Learning Program.
- APRIL 1

Room selection begins for admitted students who have registered for housing.
- MAY 1

Deadline to accept some scholarships and financial aid or to cancel your enrollment and receive a partial refund (\$250) of your enrollment deposit.
- AUGUST

Submit updated test scores and transcripts for the Final Scholarship Deadline by the Friday before classes begin for scholarship updates.
