

- **1.** Completed admission application, which also serves as the scholarship application
- 2. \$40 nonrefundable application fee or fee waiver
- **3.** Official high school transcript reflecting unweighted GPA and class rank (if available)

Complete your scholarship file

Your application for admission is also your application for scholarships, but your file is not complete until we have these items:

- Official ACT or SAT test score(s)
- Completed essay responses
- Leadership and involvement experience (honors, employment, activities, etc.)

The Early Opportunity Scholarship Deadline is **Nov. 1**, while all scholarship materials must be submitted by **Feb. 1** to ensure scholarship consideration for most awards for fall-entering students. Ways to be Admitted

COMPREHENSIVE REVIEW

At Oklahoma State University, ALL STUDENTS are encouraged to apply because we individually review each application for our holistic and alternative admission programs. We consider many factors, including high school GPA, ACT or SAT scores, responses to application essays, academic letters of recommendation, leadership experience, community involvement and accomplishments.

*OSU will accept the official superscore provided by ACT for both admission and scholarship consideration.

TEST OPTIONAL

Students have the option to apply to OSU without consideration of a test score. Students who select this option on the application will be considered for admission based on a full review of their high school transcript. Class rank is not required for test optional admission. This also applies to home school, private, parochial or other non-public high schools that are not accredited by a recognized accrediting agency.

Currently, consideration for most university scholarships requires an official test score from ACT or SAT, and we encourage students to provide us their test scores as soon as they are available for complete scholarship consideration.

ASSURED ADMISSION

Students qualify for assured admission if they meet **ONE** of the following criteria:

UNIVERSITY COMPETITIVE

- 3.0 unweighted cumulative GPA or higher *AND* top 33.3% rank in high school graduating class, *OR*
- 3.0 GPA or better in 15-unit core AND 21 ACT*/1060 SAT or higher, OR
- 24 ACT*/1160 SAT or higher.

15-Unit Core Curricular Requirements: 4 units of English (Grammar, Composition and Literature); 3 units of Mathematics (Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II and above), 3 units of History and Citizenship Skills (Must include 1 u American History and 2 units from the subjects of history, Economics, Geography, Government, Civics and/or Non-Western Culture); 3 units lab science (Biology, Chemistry, Physical Sciences, Physics or any lab science certical school district) and 2 units of other courses selected from any of the sections above or Computer Science or Foreign Language.
