Your application for admission is also your application for scholarships, but your file is not complete until we have these items:

- Official ACT or SAT test score(s)
- Completed Essay Responses
- Leadership & Involvement Experience (Honors, Employment, Activities, etc.)

The Early Opportunity Scholarship Deadline is **Nov. 1**, while all scholarship materials must be submitted by **Feb. 1** to ensure scholarship consideration for fall-entering students. For more information on how to complete your file, visit admissions.okstate.edu/scholarship-file.

Students may only receive the award with the highest value they are eligible for from the University Assured Scholarship or Partnered Scholarship categories. If selected, students may receive either the President's Distinguished Scholarship or the President's Leadership Council Scholarship. Either award may be combined with other university scholarships. Students must maintain a minimum GPA and number of credit hours per semester to renew assured scholarship opportunities each year. Renewable scholarship qualifications may vary.

ACT and SAT scores are computed without the essay score. OSU will accept the official superscore provided by ACT for both admission and scholarship consideration. FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID (FAFSA)
For grants, loans and some scholarships, you must fill out the FAFSA. We recommend all students file their 2022-2023 FAFSA as soon as possible beginning Oct. 1 for the most financial aid consideration. For more information, visit fafsa.gov.

Important Dates for Senior Year

- JULY 1** Students can apply for admission to OSU starting July 1 after their junior year of high school.
- OCT. 1** FAFSA filing opens at fafsa.gov. File your 2022-2023 FAFSA as soon as possible beginning Oct. 1 for the most financial aid consideration using **OSU school code 003170**.
- NOV. 1** Early Opportunity Scholarship Deadline. Apply by Nov. 1 to receive early scholarship and financial aid notification, and to compete for the highest level academic college awards.
- DEC. 1** Upon admission, submit your enrollment deposit beginning Dec. 1 at 8 a.m. at okla.st/portal to be eligible to register for housing and orientation and enrollment.
- FEB. 1** Priority Scholarship Deadline. Apply or update your test scores, transcripts or scholarship file by Feb. 1 to ensure scholarship consideration.
- FEB. 1** Housing registration opens at 8 a.m. at reslife.okstate.edu for admitted students who have submitted their enrollment deposit.
- FEB. 1** Registration for orientation and enrollment opens at 8 a.m. at fys.okstate.edu for admitted students who have submitted their enrollment deposit.
- MARCH 1** Room selection begins for students selected for a Living Learning Program.
- APRIL 1** Room selection begins for admitted students who have registered for housing.
- MAY 1** Deadline to accept some scholarships and financial aid or to cancel your enrollment and receive a partial refund (\$250) of your enrollment deposit.
- AUGUST** Submit updated test scores and transcripts for the Final Scholarship Deadline by the Friday before classes begin for scholarship updates.

Ways to be Admitted

COMPREHENSIVE REVIEW

At Oklahoma State University, ALL STUDENTS are encouraged to apply because we individually review each application for our holistic and alternative admission programs. We consider many factors, including high school GPA, ACT or SAT scores, responses to application essays, academic letters of recommendation, leadership experience, community involvement and accomplishments.

*OSU will accept the official superscore provided by ACT for both admission and scholarship consideration.

TEST OPTIONAL

Students have the option to apply to OSU without consideration of a test score. Students may indicate on their application for admission that they would like to be considered as test optional and submit their high school transcript for review. This also applies to home school, private, parochial or other non-public high schools that are not accredited by a recognized accrediting agency.

Currently, consideration for most university scholarships requires an official test score from ACT or SAT, and we encourage students to provide us their test scores as soon as they are available for complete scholarship consideration.

ASSURED ADMISSION

Students qualify for assured admission if they meet ONE of the following criteria:

- 3.0 unweighted cumulative GPA or higher AND top 33.3% rank in high school graduating class, OR
- 3.0 GPA or better in 15-unit core AND 21 ACT*/1060 SAT or higher, OR
- 24 ACT*/1160 SAT or higher.

15-Unit Core Curricular Requirements: 4 units of English (Grammar, Composition and Literature); 3 units of Mathematics (Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II and above); 3 units of History and Citizenship Skills (Must include 1 unit of American History and 2 units from the subjects of history, Economics, Geography, Government, Civics and/or Non-Western Culture); 3 units lab science (Biology, Chemistry, Physical Sciences, Physics or any lab science certified by school district) and 2 units of other courses selected from any of the sections above or Computer Science or Foreign Language.
