WANT TO BE AN OSU COWBOY?

Apply at apply.okstate.edu or use the Common App.

Admissions documents required:

1. Completed admission application, which also serves as the scholarship application
2. \$50 nonrefundable application fee or fee waiver
3. Official high school transcript reflecting GPA and class rank (if available)

The first step is applying for admission. At Oklahoma State, we're committed to helping qualified students get admitted to OSU to earn their college degrees.

Maximize your scholarship opportunities

Your application for admission is also your application for scholarships, but you could qualify for additional scholarships with these items:

- Official ACT or SAT test score(s)
- Completed essay response
- Leadership and involvement resume (*honors, employment, activities, etc.*)

The Early Opportunity Scholarship Deadline is **Nov. 1**, while all scholarship materials must be submitted by **Feb. 1** to ensure scholarship consideration for most awards for fall-entering students. Ways to be Admitted

COMPREHENSIVE REVIEW

At Oklahoma State University, **ALL STUDENTS** are encouraged to apply because we individually review each application for our holistic and alternative admission programs. We consider many factors, including high school GPA, ACT or SAT scores, application essay response, academic letters of recommendation, leadership experience, community involvement and accomplishments.

OSU will accept the official superscore provided by ACT for both admission and scholarship consideration. Some majors may have additional requirements, visit okla.st/program-admission for more information.

OSU uses the highest cumulative GPA (weighted or unweighted based on a 4.0 scale) indicated on a student's official high school transcript for admission and scholarship purposes. GPAs not using a 4.0 scale will be converted to a 4.0 scale.

ASSURED ADMISSION

Students qualify for assured admission if they meet **ONE** of the following criteria:

- 3.0 cumulative GPA or higher **AND** top 33.3% rank in high school graduating class, **OR**
- 3.0 GPA or better in 15-unit core **AND** 21 ACT/1060 SAT or higher, **OR**
- 24 ACT/1160 SAT or higher.

TEST OPTIONAL

Students have the option to apply to OSU without consideration of a test score. Students who select this option on the application will be considered for admission based on a full review of their high school transcript. Class rank is not required for test optional admission. This also applies to home school, private, parochial or other non-public high schools that are not accredited by a recognized accrediting agency.

Currently, consideration for most university scholarships requires an official test score from ACT or SAT, and we encourage students to provide us their test scores as soon as they are available for maximum scholarship consideration.

Students may only receive the award with the highest value they are eligible for from the University Assured Scholarship or Partnered Scholarship categories. If selected, students may receive either the President's Distinguished Scholarship or the President's Leadership Council Scholarship. Either award may be combined with other university scholarships. Students must maintain a minimum GPA and number of credit hours per semester to renew assured scholarship opportunities each year. Renewable scholarship qualifications may vary.

ACT and SAT scores are computed without the essay score. OSU will accept the official superscore provided by ACT for both admission and scholarship consideration. Important Dates for Senior Year

- JULY 1** Students can apply for admission at apply.okstate.edu starting July 1 after their junior year of high school.
- AUG. 1** Starting Aug. 1, students can apply for admission using the Common App.
- OCT. 1** File your 2025-2026 FAFSA as soon as possible beginning Oct. 1 at fafsa.gov to maximize your financial aid notification, and to compete for the highest level academic college awards.
- NOV. 1** **Early Opportunity Scholarship Deadline.** Apply by Nov. 1 to receive early scholarship and financial aid notification, and to compete for the highest level academic college awards.
- DEC. 1** Upon admission, submit your enrollment deposit beginning Dec. 1 at 8 a.m. at okla.st/portal to be eligible to register for housing and orientation and enrollment.
- FEB. 1** **Priority Scholarship Deadline.** Apply or update your test scores, transcripts or scholarship file by Feb. 1 to ensure maximum scholarship consideration.
- FEB. 1** Housing registration opens at 8 a.m. at reslife.okstate.edu for admitted students who have submitted their enrollment deposit.
- FEB. 1** Registration for orientation and enrollment opens at 8 a.m. at newstudents.okstate.edu for admitted students who have submitted their enrollment deposit.
- APRIL** Room assignments begin for students selected for a Living Learning Program and admitted students who have registered for housing.
- MAY 1** Deadline to accept some scholarships and financial aid or to cancel your enrollment and receive a partial refund (\$250) of your enrollment deposit.
- AUGUST** Submit updated test scores and transcripts for the **Final Scholarship Deadline** by the Friday before classes begin for scholarship updates.
