



CONCURRENT ADMISSION

FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

To be admitted as a concurrent student, **you must:**

- 1 Complete the online concurrent application.
- 2 Submit your test score and/or your official high school transcript reflecting unweighted GPA and class rank (if available).
- 3 Have your online approval submitted by your high school principal or counselor and a parent or guardian.
- 4 Pay the \$50 nonrefundable application fee (one time only) or submit a fee waiver.

Applicants must be on pace to satisfy all 15 high school curricular graduation requirements, which include: 4 English, 3 Mathematics, 3 History & Citizenship, 3 Lab Science and 2 Elective units.

CONCURRENT ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- ▶ 24+ ACT/Pre-ACT or 1160+ SAT/Pre-SAT **OR** top 33.3% rank in high school graduating class with at least a 3.0 unweighted cumulative GPA
- ▶ Students have the option to apply to OSU without consideration of a test score.

Students who select this option on the application and apply without a test score will be considered for admission based on a full review of their high school transcript. Class rank is NOT required for test optional admission. This option also applies to home school, private parochial or other non-public high schools which are not accredited by a recognized accrediting agency.

Students must have completed enough high school coursework to be equivalent to an individual who is classified as a junior or senior at an accredited high school.

For students applying with a standardized test score, national ACT and SAT testing is preferred for concurrent student admission. One OSU residual ACT per year may be used for concurrent admission.

AFFORDABLE AND ACCESSIBLE

Take advantage of the financial benefits of concurrent classes.

Cowboy Concurrent Online: No matter where you live, Cowboy Concurrent Online makes it easy and affordable to earn college credit while still in high school. Eligible **Oklahoma seniors** receive a tuition waiver from the state and a scholarship from the OSU Foundation to cover up to 18 hours of classes in the concurrent program. **Oklahoma juniors** receive a reduced rate of \$775 per course. **Out-of-state students** will pay \$300 per credit hour, or \$900 for a 3-credit hour course. These reduced rates apply only to Cowboy Concurrent Online courses and are based on availability. Some courses require additional investment in textbooks and exam proctoring.

Concurrent on campus: Oklahoma high school seniors receive a tuition waiver for up to 18 credit hours and juniors up to nine hours, starting in the summer term. This tuition waiver covers only the cost of your tuition. You'll still be responsible for any required fees which are charged per credit hour and vary depending on the course and the academic college providing the instruction. The Office of Concurrent Programming and Advisement can help you estimate the costs for courses you're interested in taking.

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EARN COLLEGE CREDIT WHILE YOU'RE IN HIGH SCHOOL

WHY CONCURRENT AT OSU?

Take advantage of OSU's cost-saving options and experience college during your junior or senior year of high school as a concurrent student. You'll earn dual credit for your courses and get an early start toward your college degree, all while receiving support from both high school and college academic resources.

ENROLLMENT TIMELINE:

The Office of Undergraduate Admissions recommends you apply early to ensure the courses you want are available. Select the concurrent application for the semester you want to begin classes and submit all of your documents at least three to five business days before you intend to enroll to allow our staff time to process your application and prepare your enrollment materials.

YOUR ACADEMIC ADVISOR

Once you've been admitted, you'll meet with your academic advisor. Your advisor will support you in selecting courses, planning your schedule, determining costs and offering academic guidance, which includes accessing dedicated resources for your success as a college student. Collaborate closely with both your OSU advisor and high school counselor to ensure you're aligned with your goals and staying on track for graduation.

CONTINUING CONCURRENT STUDENTS:

To continue as a concurrent student, you must submit a new online application and concurrent approval forms for each semester you want to attend. **Application fees, transcripts and test scores do not need to be resubmitted.**

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OSU AFTER HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION:

If you're interested in attending OSU beyond high school graduation, you must complete the entire freshman application for admission and scholarships and attend an orientation and enrollment session. **You're not required to submit a new application fee** if you haven't attended another institution between concurrent enrollment and applying to become a full-time student at OSU, but you must submit an up-to-date high school transcript. Apply by our Early Opportunity Scholarship Deadline on Nov. 1 or our Priority Scholarship Deadline on Feb. 1 for full scholarship consideration.
