

TRANSFER CHECKLIST

Required for admission

- APPLY ONLINE**
Complete your admission application, which also serves as your scholarship application, at apply.okstate.edu.
- APPLICATION FEE**
Pay the \$50 application fee online, or apply for an application fee waiver.
- SUBMIT TRANSCRIPTS**
Submit official transcripts (print date must be less than three months old) from each institution you've attended. Transcripts must be sent directly from the issuing school to OSU. If you have fewer than 24 credit hours, you must also submit your high school transcript and ACT/SAT scores unless you're applying for test-optional consideration.

Recommended

- SUBMIT YOUR FAFSA**
Using OSU school code **003170**, submit your FAFSA at fafsa.gov as soon as it opens in the calendar year prior to the year you plan to attend OSU.
- TOUR CAMPUS**
Touring is the best way to get to know campus. You may also meet with a representative from your academic college of choice. Special transfer tour dates are available, but all transfer students are welcome on any day a tour is held. Schedule a virtual experience or in-person visit at okla.st/visit (OSU-Stillwater) or tulsa.okstate.edu/visit (OSU-Tulsa).

Once you're admitted

- SIGN UP FOR TRANSFER ORIENTATION AND ENROLLMENT**
At these required sessions, you'll learn more about our campus resources, meet with an academic advisor and enroll in classes.
- REGISTER FOR HOUSING (OPTIONAL FOR OSU-STILLWATER ONLY)**
Transfer students can register for OSU housing, but are not required to do so. Please note, OSU housing is not guaranteed for transfer students. Learn more at reslife.okstate.edu.

Deadlines to submit your application for undergraduate admission and scholarship consideration:

- **Fall-entering students:** April 1 for priority scholarship consideration; the Friday before classes begin is the final scholarship deadline.
- **Spring-entering students:** Nov. 1 for priority scholarship consideration; the Friday before classes begin is the final scholarship deadline.

ADMISSION CRITERIA

7-23 CREDIT HOURS ATTEMPTED**
(OSU-STILLWATER ONLY)

- 2.25 overall college GPA **AND** meet one of the following Freshman Admission Requirements:
 - 3.0 cumulative GPA or higher AND top 33.3% rank in high school graduating class, **OR**
 - 3.0 GPA or higher in 15-unit core AND 21 ACT*/1060 SAT or higher, **OR**
 - 24 ACT*/1160 SAT or higher.
- Students in this category have the option to apply to OSU without consideration of a test score (test optional).
- Oklahoma State University uses the highest cumulative GPA (weighted or unweighted based on a 4.0 scale) indicated on a student's official high school transcript for admission and scholarship purposes. GPAs not using a 4.0 scale will be converted to a 4.0 scale.

OR

24-59 CREDIT HOURS ATTEMPTED**

- 2.25 overall college GPA

OR

60+ CREDIT HOURS ATTEMPTED OR ASSOCIATE DEGREE**

- 2.0 overall college GPA

*OSU will accept the official superscore provided by ACT for both admission and scholarship consideration.

**Excluding incomplete, in-progress, GPA neutral passing grades (ex: "P" or "S"), remedial/developmental, repeated/forgiven credit and activity courses.

FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID (FAFSA)

For grants, loans and some scholarships, you must fill out the FAFSA. We recommend all students file their 2025-26 FAFSA as soon as possible once it opens and have it sent to OSU. Starting Oct. 1, the FAFSA will open for a limited number of students and will become fully available to all students by Dec. 1. For more information, visit fafsa.gov.

TRANSFER SCHOLARSHIPS

Finishing your degree at Oklahoma State University can be an affordable reality. About 85% of current OSU students receive some sort of financial aid, which means your costs may be less than you think. We're here to help you navigate the process and maximize your scholarship opportunities.
