McKNIGHT SCHOLARS LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

The McKnight Scholars Leadership Program identifies, equips and empowers promising scholars from outside of Oklahoma to become leaders. The award includes a four-year out-of-state tuition waiver, a \$5,000 scholarship for freshman and sophomore years and a \$2,500 scholarship for junior and senior years.

McKnight Scholars become more aware of their passions and aptitudes, gain skills to foster collaboration, understand how communities grow and improve, make an impact in their community and prepare for influence beyond graduation. Interested students must apply to OSU and complete the scholarship application at okla.st/mcknightscholars before the Nov. 1 first-round deadline or Feb. 1 second-round deadline.

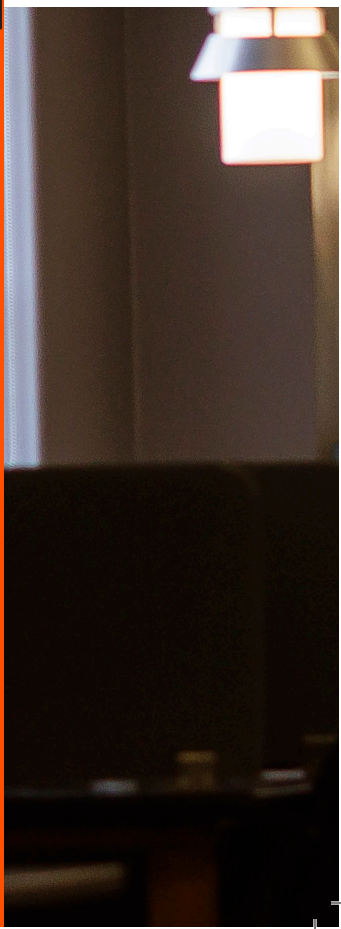
PRESIDENT'S LEADERSHIP COUNCIL

President's Leadership Council is a competitive scholarship and leadership program that offers mentorship, a first-semester course exclusive to PLC students, study abroad opportunities and a \$1,500 cash award.

This elite leadership group of high-caliber students welcomes new cohorts of first-semester transfer students in the fall and spring.

PLC emphasizes the importance of leadership and service throughout life. The course includes leadership and ethics seminars and volunteer service. Students organize a leadership conference for high school seniors and complete a small group creative component project.

ACADEMIC COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS

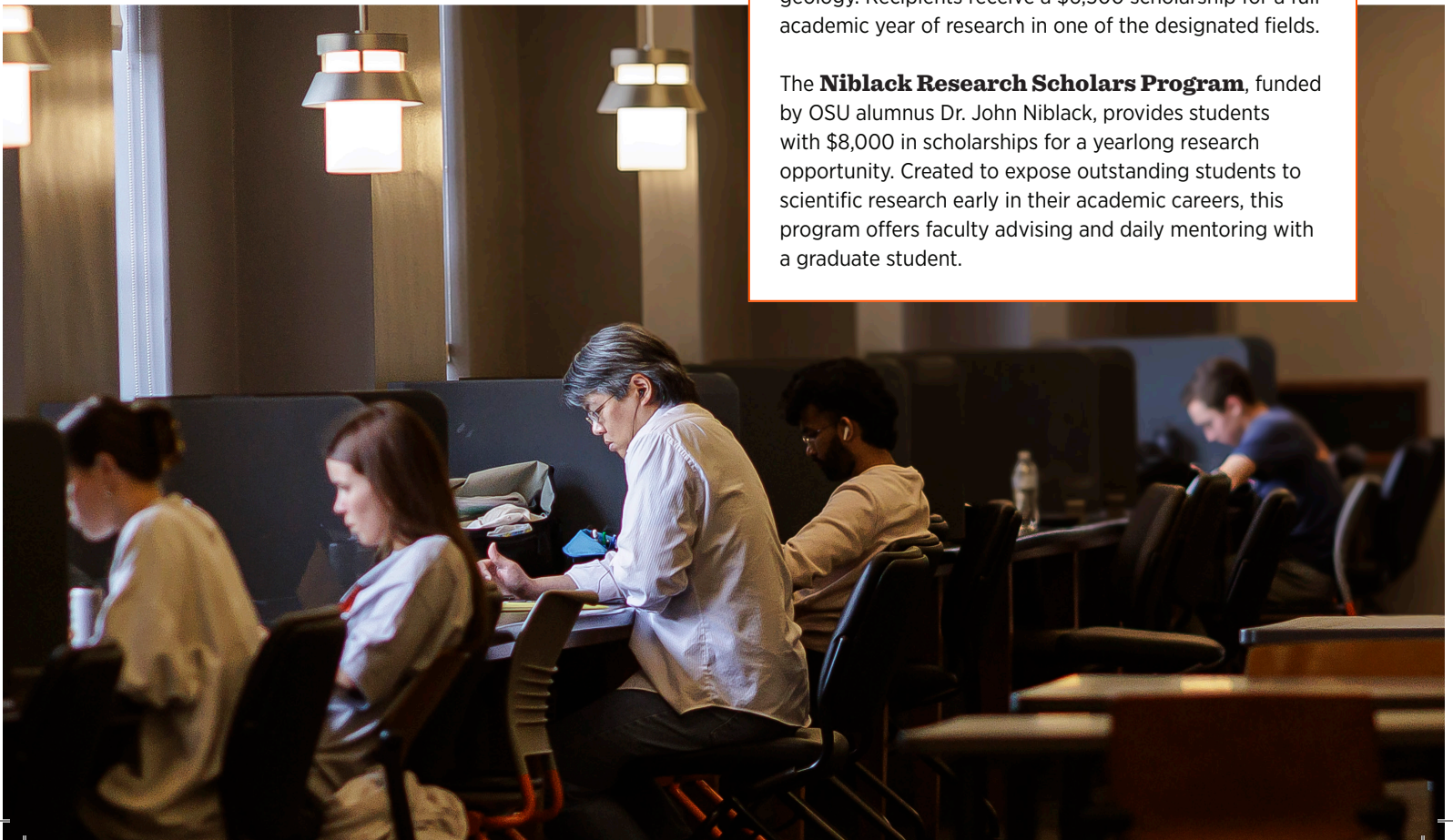
Oklahoma State University's academic colleges award scholarships using your admission application information, including your field of study, credit hours earned and GPA. The number and amount of college and departmental scholarships varies.

As you continue your journey at OSU, you'll have the opportunity to make your mark with advanced research. Learn more at scholardevelopment.okstate.edu.

The **Low Wentz Research Scholars Program** awards \$4,500 scholarships to approximately 40 undergraduate scholars to conduct independent research with a faculty mentor. Students with a minimum 3.0 GPA and 12 hours completed at OSU are eligible to apply.

The **Neil Purdie Research Scholars Program** honors former chemistry faculty member Dr. Neil Purdie by providing significant support for undergraduate research in the physical sciences of chemistry, physics and geology. Recipients receive a \$6,500 scholarship for a full academic year of research in one of the designated fields.

The **Niblack Research Scholars Program**, funded by OSU alumnus Dr. John Niblack, provides students with \$8,000 in scholarships for a yearlong research opportunity. Created to expose outstanding students to scientific research early in their academic careers, this program offers faculty advising and daily mentoring with a graduate student.



NATIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS

OSU has a record of success in preparing students for some of the most sought-after opportunities across the country. As you continue your college career, OSU's Office of Scholar Development and Undergraduate Research can help you develop the academic profile necessary to compete for these prestigious awards.

The **Harry S. Truman Scholarship** was created by Congress for students who intend to pursue careers in public service. Truman Scholars demonstrate outstanding leadership potential, a commitment to a career in government or the nonprofit sector, and academic excellence. This year, OSU's Truman Scholarship Committee will select up to four OSU juniors to compete for the national scholarship.

The **Barry M. Goldwater Scholarship** was created by Congress to honor Sen. Goldwater and encourage excellence in the areas of natural science, mathematics or engineering. This award is designed for students who have a strong record of undergraduate research as demonstrated by ongoing or completed projects, reports, presentations and publications. OSU can nominate up to four applicants to compete for the Goldwater Scholarship each year.

The **Morris K. and Stewart L. Udall Scholarship** was created by Congress to honor Congressman Morris K. Udall, later to include Stewart L. Udall. It is awarded to students with career aspirations related to the environment or Native American and Alaska Native undergraduate students who intend to pursue careers in native health care or tribal public policy. This award benefits those students who have a strong record of undergraduate research or public service.



All successful applicants who are awarded OSU institutional nominations for the Truman, Goldwater and Udall scholarships will receive an invitation to participate in the **Burns and Ann Hargis Writers' Workshop** at the OSU Doel Reed Center for the Arts in Taos, New Mexico. Significant scholarship support is given to each institutional nominee to participate in the workshop, which is held for four days during the last week of students' winter break.
