STUDY ABROAD OPPORTUNITIES



FACULTY ADVISING

When awarding scholarships, the Ferguson College of Agriculture looks at several areas of a student's background including (but not limited to) scholastic standing in high school or college, leadership qualities, financial need and sincere interest in the various agriculture and natural resource disciplines.

Students from all majors are considered for university scholarships which can be combined with college and departmental scholarship opportunities.

HOW TO APPLY

Applying for scholarships is easy. Your admission application is also used as your scholarship application, so be sure to fill out the leadership and activity résumé! While essays are not required, that information can be used for scholarship selections.

WHEN TO APPLY

For fall semester entry, completed admission/scholarship applications must be submitted by February 1 to be considered for OSU, college and departmental scholarships. For priority scholarship consideration, submit your application materials by December 1.
