Cost-Savings Tips:

- **Choose a less-expensive housing option.** The price differences between community-style residence halls and suites or a private room and a shared room can add up quickly.
- Make the most of your meal plan. Save eating off campus for special occasions, and keep track of your rollover amounts each semester.
- Buy used textbooks, if possible. Be sure you know the store's return and buy-back policies on textbooks.
- Avoid parking tickets. Take advantage of OSU's bus system on campus and around Stillwater. You can also try bringing a bicycle to campus.
- Keep track of charges you make. Treat your student ID card like a bank card. Review your OSU Student Account online at least once a week.
- Limit how much you spend on optional items. Create a budget and set spending limits for yourself.
